You are invited to use this design on any **flat** surface. You can use paint, decoupage, embroidery and enlarge or reduce the pattern to create your piece, but the pattern cannot be altered in any fashion and must be traced.

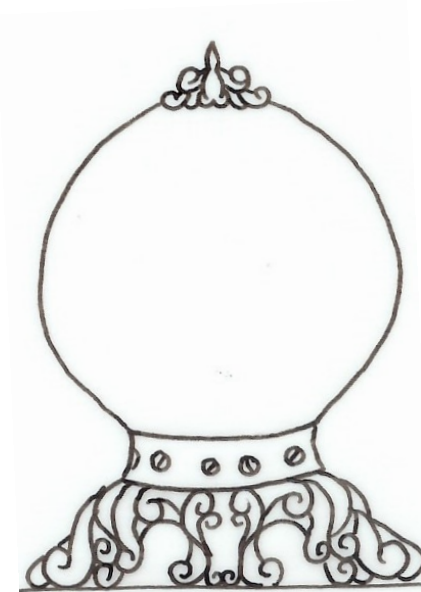
The pattern can be added to or enhanced but the original design must remain unaltered & visible. **The competition is open to all members** – not only those attending the Getaway. To enter, hand your completed piece to a committee member before the Getaway or hand it in at registration at the Getaway.

All entries must be anonymous. Please do not sign your piece.

All pieces will be on display throughout the weekend and all attending will be asked to Vote for their favourite piece. This is a people's choice competition and the winners will be announced at our Sunday lunch at the closing of our weekend. 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winner's names will be engraved on the perpetual trophy with a personal medal also being presented. A monetary prize of \$100, \$50 and \$25 for 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes respectively will be awarded. There will be a special prize of \$25 and medal once again for **Most Popular Student Entry**.

The pieces by students will be clearly marked when they are displayed. So don't be shy everyone is judged fairly by the people attending the Getaway.
